

## WEEK 1 – MADE ON PURPOSE: The Identity of a Man

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### Anchor Scripture

#### **Genesis 1:26–27 (ESV)**

*“Then God said, ‘Let Us make man in Our image, after Our likeness...’ So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.”*

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### Opening / Connector (5 min)

Ask the group:


*“What is the first thing you think of when you hear the word ‘man’?”*

Let participants share short answers.

Then ask:

*“Who has defined you as a man — culture, family, peers...or God?”*

This session begins by challenging men to compare **cultural definitions of manhood** with the **divine definition revealed in Genesis**.



### Teaching Focus

#### **Theme:**

Your identity as a man isn't something **you invented**. It is something **you were made to reflect** — the image and character of God.

Men aren't an *afterthought* of creation; they are a purposeful **image-bearer** of life, rule, strength, and responsibility.

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### Commentary for the Anchor Scripture

Genesis 1:26–27 reveals three eternal truths about men:

#### **1. Man is made in God’s Image**

Men carry God's imprint: intellect, creativity, morality, and leadership. Being in God's image is not tied to performance but origin — God *made* you for His image. A man without identity in God ends up chasing shadows of manhood in culture.

#### **2. Image Includes Authority and Responsibility**

God gave man creative authority — *to steward, to rule, to protect, to build* (Genesis

1:26). This is not dominance but **responsibility under God**. True authority obeys its Source first.

### 3. Being God's Image–Bearer Shapes Purpose

Men don't define themselves by society's standards; they *discover* themselves through God's Word and their purpose from God's design. When a man embraces who God says he is, he can live without the insecurity that drives so many men today.

#### Supporting Scriptures

- **Psalm 139:13–16** — God knows you personally, from inside the womb.
- **Jeremiah 1:4–5** — God called you before birth.
- **Ephesians 2:10** — You are God's workmanship, created for good works before time began.

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#### Keys to Grow (10 min)

**Key Truth #1:** Your identity is *fixed* in God, not fluctuating with culture.

**Key Truth #2:** Identity precedes destiny — you *must know who you are before you can do what God calls you to do.*\*

**Key Truth #3:** Identity gives you stability in adversity.

#### Reflection Prompt:

*Can you remember the moment you began to believe a lie about who you are as a man?*

Take 2 minutes of quiet to reflect and write.

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#### Spotlight of a Christian Man

##### Greg Laurie — Godly Masculinity in Modern Culture

In 2025, Pastor Greg Laurie noted that Christian men are rejecting cultural stereotypes of masculinity and are returning to a biblical understanding of being **protectors, leaders, and servants for Christ**. He emphasizes strength under control and sacrificial love — modeled on Jesus Himself.

#### Takeaway:

Real manhood does not imitate the world — it imitates Christ.

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#### News Highlight (Contemporary Article)

## **“New Report Reveals Challenges Facing Christian Fathers — and a Path Forward”**

A 2025 assessment of biblical fatherhood uncovered that a majority of Christian fathers struggle with regular prayer, Scripture engagement, and discipleship in the home — pointing to a **gap between identity and lived practice** among men today.

This affirms the need for identity formation before functional ministry.
