What causes bad breath?

What Causes Bad Breath?

It is caused by bacteria in our mouth, Halitosis.

This bacteria is breaking down food debris which creates by-products called volatile sulfur compounds (methyl mercaptan and hydrogen sulfide) which emit a smell similar to rotten eggs. Bacteria, just like humans, consume food and excreting waste.



And it is these **sulfur compounds (waste)** that usually lie at the root of a person's breath problems.

Because this bacteria needs an environment free of oxygen, they will live in areas that are difficult to reach-such as: pockets around teeth (A-B); the grooves in the tongue (C) and especially on the back of the tongue (D).



TOP 10 Worst Home Remedies for Bad Breath



Excessive mouthwash use...this produces sloughy, bad smelling tissue that is worse than you breath!



Brushing with cleanser. It is poisonous and dangerous. Don't laugh people do this!



Chewing gum...it only masks bad breath



Mint chew tobacco...smokeless tobacco causes gums to recede and increases the chance of losing the bone and fibers that hold your teeth in place and can cause oral cancer.

Using mouthrinses with alcohol.....dries out gum tissue and only covers bad breath it does not deal with the cause.

Tongue piercing...allow you to harbor more bacteria on your tongue where sulfur compounds that cause bad breath live.



Alcohol.....will cause dry mouth causing bad breath.

Five Steps From Entrance to Encounter



Duties of the Gershonites (4:21 - 28)

- Gershonites were to carry
 - the curtains of the tabernacle and the tent of meeting
 - The covering of goatskin that was on top
 - The screen for the entrance of the tent of meeting
 - The hangings of the court
 - The screen for the entrance of the gate of the court
 - They followed the command of Aaron and his sons.

Duties of the Kohathites (4:1 – 20)

- Clan of Moses and Aaron
- Kohathites had the most sacred assignment: carry “the sanctuary and all the furnishings” after Aaron and his sons “have finished covering” them. (v. 15)
- They were not to touch or even “to look on the holy things...lest they die”(v. 20)

Duties of the Merarites (4:29 - 33)

- Merarites were under the direction of Ithamar the son of Aaron the priest
- Merarites were to carry
 - The frames of the tabernacle
 - Its bars, pillars, and bases
 - The pillars around the court with their bases, pegs, and cords, with all their equipment and all their accessories





Addiction Defined

Addiction is defined as obsessive thinking and compulsive need for drugs, alcohol, food, sex or anything despite the resulting negative consequences. Addiction includes the development of tolerance combined with withdrawal symptoms. In addition to tolerance, an addict or alcoholic will experience intense physical cravings for the drug and an emotional obsession to take alcohol or drugs regardless of the consequences. Addiction develops over time and usually begins with misuse, moving toward abuse and resulting in addiction.

The Cycle of Addiction

The Cycle of Addiction Is Characterized By:

- Frustration and internal pain that leads to anxiety and a demand for relief of these symptoms
- Fantasizing about using alcohol and drugs or behaviors to relieve the uncomfortable symptoms
- Obsessing about using drugs and alcohol and how his or her life will be after the use of substances

- Engaging in the addictive activity, such as using substances to gain relief (acting out)
- Losing control over the behavior
- Developing feelings of remorse, guilt and shame, which lead to feelings of dissatisfaction
- Making a promise or resolve to oneself to stop the behavior or substance use

After a period of time, the pain returns, and the addict begins to experience the fantasies of using substances again.

Breaking the Cycle of Addiction

The stages of the cycle of addiction can be matched up with some of the stages of the model of behavior change and its relationship to recovery.

1.Precontemplation -The addict has not yet considered stopping the behavior or use of substances.

2.Contemplation – The addict is starting to consider making a change in behavior.

3.Preparation – The addict is mentally and, possibly, physically preparing to make a change.

4.Action – The addict has taken an action, such as seeking treatment, self-help groups or counseling. Treatment has been provided and the addict has stopped using.

5.Maintenance – The addict is maintaining his or her new lifestyle and behavior, following a recovery program

Unfortunately, relapse can occur during the action or maintenance stage, which means the addict or alcoholic again enters the cycle of addiction.

A Drug Personality May:

- Have mood swings
- Be unreliable
- Be unable to finish projects
- Have unexpressed resentment
- Be dishonest and lie to family, friends and employers
- Isolate and withdraw from loved ones
- Appear chronically depressed
- Begin stealing from family and friends
- Engage in risky sexual behavior
- Exhibit strong, primitive defense mechanisms (denial, rationalization, minimization, projection, justification, blaming)
- Have difficulty paying bills
- Have difficulty with interpersonal relationships
- Have difficulty with work relationships or is unable to hold a job
- Engage in illegal or immoral activities to obtain drugs

Common **WARNING SIGNS** of Mental Illness


Diagnosing mental illness isn't a straightforward science. We can't test for it the same way we can test blood sugar levels for diabetes. Each condition has its own set of unique symptoms, though symptoms often overlap. Common signs and/or symptoms can include:

- ! **Feeling very sad or withdrawn for more than two weeks**
- ! **Trying to harm or end one's life or making plans to do so**
- ! **Severe, out-of-control, risk-taking behavior that causes harm to self or others**
- ! **Sudden overwhelming fear for no reason, sometimes with a racing heart, physical discomfort or difficulty breathing**
- ! **Significant weight loss or gain**



- ! **Seeing, hearing or believing things that aren't real***
- ! **Excessive use of alcohol or drugs**
- ! **Drastic changes in mood, behavior, personality or sleeping habits**
- ! **Extreme difficulty concentrating or staying still**
- ! **Intense worries or fears that get in the way of daily activities**

*Various communities and backgrounds might view this sign differently based on their beliefs and experiences. Some people within these communities and cultures may not interpret hearing voices as unusual.

There are some simple strategies that will help you connect with the person in distress:

- introduce yourself calmly and clearly
- explain why you are there
- be polite and non-threatening but also be honest and direct
- listen to what they are saying in a non-judgmental way
- avoid confrontation
- ask them what they see as the main problem
- do not attempt physical contact, except to prevent serious assault or suicide attempts
- encourage them to talk to a mental healthcare professional
- follow up difficult experiences with counselling for yourself.

DEMON POSSESSION



Biblical Terminology Related to “Demon Possession”

The term “demon possession” is frequently used in English translations of the New Testament, most notably in the Synoptic Gospels, to render the meaning of the term *daimonizomai*. In addition, the parallels between Matthew 8:28, Mark 5:2 and Luke 8:27 suggest that the terms “with an unclean spirit” (*en pneumatī akathartō*) and “having a demon” (*echōn daimonian*) are viewed as similar in meaning (cf. Mark 1:23/Luke 4:33), both to each other and to *daimonizomai*. These terms seem to indicate the presence of demons or unclean spirits, who are exerting a degree of regular or intermittent and pernicious influence in a person’s life.

Symptoms of “Demon Possession”

The symptoms associated with “demon possession” vary significantly from one exorcism account to another. On the one hand, this condition may produce symptoms that are difficult to distinguish from those of illnesses that are simply the result of living in a fallen world. Specific accounts refer to an inability to speak, whether mentioned alone (Matt. 9:32-33/Luke 11:14), together with blindness (Matt. 12:22-23), or as accompanied by intermittent seizures and an inability to hear (Mark 9:14-29). In addition, Matthew 17:14-20 which contains a general reference to seizures that are associated with “great suffering.

On the other hand one encounters as well the case of the Gadarene demoniacs in Matthew 8:28-34, which is parallel to the accounts of the Gerasene demoniac in Mark 5:1-20/Luke 8:26-39. In this case the symptoms of demonic influence mimic a severe psychological or psychiatric disorder which include ferocity (Matt. 8:28), social isolation (i.e., living among the tombs—Matt. 8:28; Mark 5:2; Luke 8:27), dwelling on the mountains (Mark 5:5), “driven by the demon into the desert” (Luke 8:29), nakedness (Luke 8:27), self-harm (Mark 5:5), and excessive strength (Mark 5:3; Luke 8:29).



Position Overview:

The Altar Workers and Baptism Ministry Team at Bethesda Churches is responsible for assisting individuals in responding to the call of salvation, providing prayer support, and leading people through the process of baptism. The ministry team plays a critical role in fulfilling the Apostolic faith by guiding individuals in the experience of repentance, baptism in the name of Jesus Christ, and receiving the infilling of the Holy Spirit. This ministry aligns with Bethesda's mission to make champions for Jesus Christ who bring healing to the nations through worship, life groups, personal evangelism, and serving on ministry teams. ***The team's responsibility is to ensure a powerful, transformative experience for every individual at the altar, empowering them to take the next step in their spiritual journey.***

Duties and Responsibilities:

Altar Call Support and Prayer:

- Assist in leading altar calls during worship services, inviting individuals to come forward for prayer, salvation, and healing.
- Provide personal prayer support to individuals responding to the altar call, focusing on **repentance**, **rededication**, and **salvation** in the name of Jesus Christ.
- Pray with individuals seeking deliverance, healing, or the baptism of the Holy Spirit, ensuring they experience spiritual breakthrough.
- Help individuals understand the importance of **repentance**, **baptism**, and **receiving the Holy Spirit**, in accordance with the Apostolic doctrine.

Baptismal Ministry:

- Assist in the baptism process, ensuring candidates understand the significance of being baptized in the name of **Jesus Christ** as per Acts 2:38.
- Help prepare baptismal candidates, ensuring they understand the doctrinal importance of baptism for the forgiveness of sins and the infilling of the Holy Spirit.
- Participate in baptism services, offering emotional and spiritual support to candidates and their families during this pivotal moment in their faith journey.
- Maintain cleanliness and organization of the baptismal area and supplies.

Follow-up and Discipleship:

- Connect with individuals who have been baptized or have responded to the altar call, offering ongoing discipleship, prayer, and connection to life groups or other ministry teams.
- Provide resources to new believers, such as Apostolic teachings on salvation, the power of baptism, and the Holy Spirit's role in their spiritual walk.
- Coordinate with the pastoral team to follow up with individuals to ensure they are integrating into church life and deepening their relationship with God.

Training and Empowerment:

- Participate in regular training sessions on **prayer ministry**, **understanding the Apostolic doctrine**, and how to effectively minister at the altar.
- Mentor and equip new altar workers to ensure the team is well-prepared to minister with compassion, wisdom, and understanding of the importance of baptism and the infilling of the Holy Spirit.
- Train the team in how to pray for individuals seeking baptism in the Holy Spirit, helping them to understand and experience this vital aspect of their faith. Train team in how to employ strategies for people to receive deliverance.

Potential Activities:

Baptismal Services:

- Organize and facilitate regular baptismal services, both during scheduled church services and special events, ensuring that all participants are prepared and supported.

Altar Call Ministry:

- Lead altar calls at every service, ensuring that individuals have the opportunity to respond to God's call for salvation, healing, or rededication.
- Prepare and lead prayer teams to minister to those coming to the altar.

Baptism Preparation Classes:

- Conduct pre-baptism classes or one-on-one sessions to explain the significance of baptism in Jesus' name, in alignment with **Acts 2:38** and **Mark 16:16**, and the doctrinal importance of this act in the Apostolic faith.

4. **Healing and Deliverance Ministry:**

- Offer prayer and support to individuals seeking healing or deliverance, in keeping with the **Apostolic doctrine** of spiritual empowerment through prayer and laying on of hands.

5. **Special Prayer Services:**

- Host periodic special prayer services for those seeking the infilling of the Holy Spirit, offering guidance, prayer, and ministry to help individuals experience the fullness of God's Spirit.

Tips for Growing in the Altar Workers and Baptism Ministry:

1. **Cultivate a Spirit of Compassion and Patience:** Ministry at the altar is a deeply spiritual and personal experience. Approach each individual with empathy, patience, and love, understanding that God's timing is perfect in each situation.
2. **Know the Apostolic Doctrine:** Stay grounded in the tenets of the **Apostolic faith**, especially the critical role of **repentance, baptism in Jesus' name**, and **the infilling of the Holy Spirit**. Be ready to explain these steps to those responding at the altar.
3. **Empower Others:** As the team grows, mentor new altar workers and guide them in how to minister at the altar. Equip them with understanding and spiritual tools to pray effectively and lead others to Christ.
4. **Be Sensitive to the Holy Spirit:** The work at the altar requires sensitivity to the leading of the Holy Spirit. Seek God's direction in every interaction, and be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit as you pray for individuals.
5. **Follow-Up is Key:** After individuals respond to the altar call or are baptized, ensure there is thorough follow-up to guide them in their discipleship journey and to keep them connected to the church body.

Quality Review:

The effectiveness of the **Altar Workers and Baptism Ministry Team** will be assessed through:

- **Spiritual Impact:** Evaluating how many individuals have responded to the altar call for salvation, rededication, or baptism, and how many of them have been successfully integrated into church life and discipleship.
- **Feedback from New Believers:** Gathering feedback from individuals who have been baptized or responded to the altar call regarding their experience, spiritual growth, and ongoing connection to the church.
- **Team Performance:** Reviewing the effectiveness of the altar workers in their prayer ministry, baptismal services, and ability to minister in alignment with the Apostolic faith.
- **Baptismal Tracking:** Tracking the number of baptisms that occur as a result of altar ministry, including follow-up with each individual to ensure they understand their new identity in Christ.

Specific Measurable Goals:

1. Baptism Participation:

- Goal: Baptize at least 100 new believers in Jesus' name annually through regular altar calls and baptism services.

2. Altar Call Response:

- Goal: Have at least 200 individuals respond to altar calls for salvation, healing, or rededication per year.

3. New Believer Follow-Up:

- Goal: Ensure that 95% of individuals who respond to the altar call or are baptized receive proper follow-up and are integrated into a life group or discipleship process.

4. Team Training and Development:

- Goal: Train and equip at least 15 new altar workers annually, ensuring they are grounded in the Apostolic doctrine and capable of effectively ministering to individuals at the altar.

5. Spiritual Milestones:

Ministering Guidelines At The Altar


- When the candidate approaches the altar ask the universal question.
- “What do you want the Lord to do for you today?”
- After the candidate responds, proceed to pray for them
- Signal the altar worker who will stand next to the candidate to assist in ministry.

UNIVERSAL SIGNAL FOR MINISTRY

- **COUNSEL:** A gentle pull on your ear lobe indicates the candidate needs to be counseled (expound more on the word of God to them.)
- **HOLY GHOST:** A closed fist indicates the candidate needs the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
- **BAPTISMAL:** By bending the opened right hand to the left and to the right indicates the candidate needs to be baptized.
- **DELIVERANCE:** A closed fist motion to the left and right indicates the candidate needs deliverance.
- **PRAYER:** An opened right hand will indicate the candidate only wants prayer.
- If a candidate needs to be worked with further please move them to the prayer room. (ALWAYS WORK IN PAIRS OF TWO OR MORE WHEN POSSIBLE).

AISLE WORKER 2 (STANDING MIDWAY THE AISLE)


- You've made the right step

- What do you want from the Lord?

Workers for Those Who are Ready to Repent (Standing in front of the pulpit)

- Acts chapter 3 verse 19
- Do you understand what repentance is...Godly sorrow...
- It means that you are sorry for the things that you've done to the point that you are willing to turn away from those things....
- You're sorry that you've put off coming to the Lord until now...
- Acknowledging that you are a sinner in need of God's help...

Workers for Those Seeking the Holy Ghost

Standing at strategic locations to see and be able to respond to a souls need.

- Acts chapter 2:38, Acts 1:8,
- According to the bible, since you have repented and are consenting to be baptized, you shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost...”
- (Emphasize positively that they shall receive the Holy Ghost coming out of the water.)

Note: Workers for those seeking the holy ghost are prepared to tarry “wait” with the individual.

BAPTISMAL WORKERS (STATIONED IN THE CHANGING ROOMS) BAPTISMAL MINISTERS (IN THE WATER)

- Believe the Lord and you shall receive the Holy Ghost speaking in tongues as you come up out of the water...”
- Let those words flow
- Believe the Lord...
- Some things the soul may say, “I believe that Jesus Christ died for my sins...” and “I want him to become Lord of my Life...”

Deliverance Prayers

- Workers at the mouth of the aisles or another altar worker not praying for someone will need to be mindful and watchful.
- If a soul is becoming animated as they are seeking deliverance, a supporting worker should support with the intention to keep the soul safe and others around them safe.
- Cover blankets are used to ensure the soul's body is covered if there is a risk for bodily exposure

After Deliverance/After Infilling/After Baptism

- After a prayer of deliverance, an attempt should be made to connect with the soul if they are not a part of your congregation
- After infilling, the soul should be able to state they have received the holy ghost if that was their intent in coming to the altar. Those who the Holy Spirit falls on may need the altar worker to tell them what happened (This should only be done by a seasoned or trained altar worker).
- After infilling and/or baptism in water, the soul should receive a certificate acknowledging their experience.

BAPTISM DECLARATION EXAMPLE

- My Dear Brother/Sister, Upon the confession of your faith and believe in God's eternal word concerning the death burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and the confidence and obedience you have in that word, found in Matthew 29:19, Mark 16:16, Luke 24:47, John 3:5, and Acts 2:38, and upon the authority given to the apostles, and now given to me as a minister of the gospel/elder of the gospel/pastor of this church/Bishop of this church, we now indeed baptize you in water, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ for the remission of your sins, and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. (if they have the Holy Ghost) and you shall rise to the newness of life or you shall receive a refreshing of the Holy Ghost.
