

In the Gospel of John, there is a story of a man who was miraculously healed by Jesus. This man was sitting at a pool called Bethesda, which means *house of mercy*. This pool area had five porches, which is symbolic of *grace*, and had multitudes of people waiting by it for an angel to come stir the waters at a certain season. When the angel would stir the waters, whoever would get in the water first would be healed. When Jesus passed by, he noticed a lame man who had been lame for 38 years. Jesus showed his power as Lord by healing the man without the need for the water to be stirred (John 5: 1-9). Thus, Bethesda is a house of mercy whose waters are stirred continuously, because Jesus is the source and provider of salvation, healing, life, and restoration. At Bethesda, Jesus is the focus of all we do.



The Founder of the Bethesda Apostolic Church:

THE HONORABLE BISHOP HENRY L. JOHNSON

Diocesan Bishop of the 16th Episcopal District Council, PAW Inc. Founder, President of the Bishop Henry L. Johnson Bible College



Our Grace, the Honorable Bishop Henry L. Johnson wass the Diocesan Bishop of the 16th Episcopal District of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World Inc. He oversees over 120 churches in California and has funded, founded and/or been the cause of over 20 churches during his life of leadership. He is a devoted husband and Father, theologian, master teacher, counselor, compassionate undershepherd, writer, dreamer, visionary, and anointed messenger of God. He has

been the Diocesan Bishop of the Pacific Northwest District Council and Eastern Caribbean diocese. He is a leader among leaders and one of the most influential men of our time. On the State level, he has served as Chairman of the Aenon Alumni Association, Assistant Secretary of the California-Nevada-Hawaii District Council, and Chairman of the By-Laws Committee. He served three (3) terms as Assistant Chairman of the California-Nevada-Hawaii District Council and Vice President of Curriculum at Aenon Bible College, West Coast. In Fresno, he is the most emblemized figure among both clergy and secular leaders.

On May 7, 1957, Bishop Johnson founded Bethesda Apostolic Church. The first home of the Bethesda Apostolic Church was on Rose St and Grove; known to most as Rose and Grove. The congregation grew swiftly and needed to find another church in by 1962. In 1962 this thriving church moved to Church Street, where God miraculously gave favor. Healing, deliverance and salvation became the reputation of the Bethesda Apostolic Church as people came from near and far to experience the favor God was

demonstrating. In just 8 short years, the Bethesda Apostolic Church needed yet another facility that could hold all of the programs, ministries and members. In 1970, Bethesda Apostolic Church moved to Whites Bridge Street. God continued to show favor to this thriving body of believers by giving them the grace to provide vital programs for the community. Many great ministers, preachers, pastors, and missionaries were groomed and nurtured during this era. Bethesda was known for its powerful services and outstanding choir, which included a full band; some called this band an "orchestra" because of all of the instrument players. Bethesda Apostolic Church continues to equip leaders today and revolutionize the lives



of people through the gospel of Jesus Christ. It is estimated that thousands of people have been brought to the Lord under his ministry and many have been trained or influenced by Bishop Johnson to be leaders in Christian ministry.



The Honorable Bishop Henry L. Johnson's years of ministry and leadership has allowed many opportunities for The Bethesda Apostolic Church to service men, women and children in the community; serving meals and providing clothing for those who were hungry and homeless. The Bethesda Church has conducted prison ministry, food distributions, assisting the unemployed to find jobs, participating in programs to provide gifts for children of prisoners at Christmas time and neighborhood prayer walks. The Bethesda Church has initiated housing rehabilitation classes

sponsored by City departments and an alternative school for students not able to function within the regular classroom environment.

Bethesda has been the site of voter information meetings for the community, given visible support at City Council meetings and rallies where issues that would change the face of our community were at risk; through Bible-centered teaching continues to promote Christian values, morals and attitudes that change the thinking and behavior of individuals and cause each to be better citizens. Tobaise Brookins is an ordained Elder in the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World. He was ordained by the honorable Bishop Henry L. Johnson, diocesan of the 16th Episcopal District of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World. He is a preacher, evangelist, teacher, coach, consultant, Christian education specialist and author. Tobaise Brookins was born in Los Angeles County. Tobaise Brookins was an All American high school athlete; receiving a full scholarship to the University of Washington. He has a thriving and powerful evangelistic ministry which focuses on church growth, saving of souls, life-coaching and Christian organization consultation. As an educator, he holds Two Master's degrees and is currently working on a Phd in Educational Administration and Leadership. He has taught special education students in the Los Angeles Unified School District for 12 years and has also taught in the New York Public School District. He has founded two Educational Programs; T.O.Y.S - Tapping Opportunities for Youth to Succeed (Northridge, CA) and B.E.S.T.-Bethesda Educational Services & Training program (Fresno, CA). He has recently founded The Gates Alliance, which is a Christian programming, resources and consulting organization. These programs are only a continuation of his strong record of spearheading powerful church development programs, social programs and Kingdom connections.

Born Again

Now that you have been born again, or are seeking the new birth experience, it is important to be able to identify the new birth experience in the word of God, receive it and be able to share it with others. When we use the phrase born again in the Church, we are talking about the process established by God to save and regenerate people to live a new life in Him. Because of the sin of the first man Adam, all humanity was condemned to a life without peace with God. To be absent from God is death. This is why we must be born again spiritually, so that we can have peace with God (Romans 5:1) and live the life promised and ordained for us (Genesis 1:28, 12:2-3, Deuteronomy 28:1-14, John 10:10). Take note of the sin and redemption process:

- 1. Romans 5:12 "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned"
- 2. Romans 3:24 "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;"
- 3. Romans 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord"
- 4. Romans 5:15 "But not as the offence, so also is the free gift. For if through the offence of one many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many"
- 5. John 3:16-17 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved."

Therefore, God has sanctioned a process to provide salvation and a process for us to receive the salvation provision. When you have been born again, you have committed your belief in Jesus Christ, have repented of your sins, been baptized in Jesus Name, and been filled with the Holy Spirit. This experience constitutes the New Birth (John 3:5). You are a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). Therefore, belief, repentance, baptism, and infilling of the Holy Ghost are extremely important to understand as you begin, experience, and grow from your New Birth. The New Birth experience gives you the power to see spiritually. You are no longer limited to only natural vision. You have the

ability to see in the spiritual realm, which gives you the power to engage in spiritual warfare, make "God" decisions, and have Kingdom principles revealed to you by the power of God.

You also have the ability to live a life of power and influence. You are no longer bound by the chains of this life when you are born again. This does not mean that you will never be tempted or ever fall. It simply means that you now have the supernatural power of the Holy Spirit to furnish you with the ability to stand firm in this world (2 Peter 1:3).

The new birth experience must be fortified by prayer, fasting and worship. You must have an active prayer, fasting and worship lifestyle if you want to reap the benefits of entering the Kingdom. The Believer should engage in daily prayer. Find a time in the morning and evening to pray. Prayer is not as difficult as some would think. Prayer is simply expressing your thoughts, concerns, and issues to God. God loves to hear us pray. Please note that He also desires to speak back to us. Thus, prayer is communication with God. When we pray, we repent for the things we have done wrong, express the things we are struggling with, intercede for our family, church, and other people, and express to God our desire to be more like Christ. Prayer should also be done in conjunction with fasting. Fasting is when we sacrifice food and various forms of entertainment/enjoyment for a set amount of time so that we might be able to hear from God and put our flesh under subjection. The reason fasting is so powerful, is because it increases your spiritual senses. You will not be able to have a successful Christian walk without having a keen and sensitive spiritual demeanor. Worship is the act of giving God acknowledgment and accolades for who He is. This also encompasses Praise. The Believer must live a life of worship. Worship is not just something we do during Sunday morning service. It is a lifestyle. This is why as a New Overcomer you are encouraged to surround yourself with worship in a spiritual environment. Gospel music and other spiritual supplements will help you build a life of worship.

There are 8 Tenants that are vital for the New Overcomer to understand regarding the New Birth. The first four are connected to experiencing the New Birth Experience and the other four are vital in securing an overcoming life.

- 1. Belief/Faith 2. Repentance
- 3. Baptism in Jesus Name 4. Infilling of the Holy Ghost

- 5. Prayer
- 6. Fasting
- 7. Studying the Word
- 8. Worship/Praise

Belief/Faith

Belief and faith is the Kingdom's currency. It is impossible to realize any of the Kingdom's blessings, promises, and victory without faith. When we receive God's Word, it creates faith. This faith is what the believer uses to stand on throughout life's most difficult situation. Belief is also essential in order for the believer to experience a full and prosperous Christian life. When we say we believe God, we are saying we trust Him. It is through faith that we demonstrate our total reliance on God to fulfill His Word in our lives. Concerning salvation, faith is the key ingredient. No one can come to God without faith. No one can receive the Holy Spirit without faith. If someone is baptized without faith, they did nothing more than get wet. Faith is the piston upon which the whole Kingdom revolves.

Matthew 8:13

And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast **believe**d, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour.

Matthew 17:20

And Jesus said unto them, Because of your unbelief: for verily I say unto you, If ye have **faith** as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you.

Jesus answered and said unto them, Verily I say unto you, If ye have **faith**, and doubt not, ye shall not only do this which is done to the fig tree, but also if ye shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; it shall be done.

Repentance

Repentance is the act of turning away from sin to the truth and holiness of God. There are two types of repentance. There is the repentance and godly sorrow shown to God when one is coming out of the world, into the body of Christ. Then there is the daily repentance we present to God for the forgiveness of sin after they have been remitted through the new birth experience. The following scriptures demonstrate both of these types of repentance and should be used to encourage the believer to live a life of repentance.

2 Chronicles 7:14

¹⁴If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

Psalm 51:7-17

⁷Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

- ⁸Make me to hear joy and gladness; that the bones which thou hast broken may rejoice.
- ⁹Hide thy face from my sins, and blot out all mine iniquities.
- ¹⁰Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.
- ¹¹Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy holy spirit from me.
- ¹²Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; and uphold me with thy free spirit.
- ¹³Then will I teach transgressors thy ways; and sinners shall be converted unto thee.

¹⁴Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, thou God of my salvation: and my tongue shall sing aloud of thy righteousness.

Baptism and Infilling of the Holy Spirit

Baptism means to be immersed in water. Baptism one of God's powerful symbols and sanctioned acts demonstrating the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is the answer of a good conscious towards God, which makes it the most powerful act in the New Testament. It is a part of the new birth experience, the public confession of faith and a part of the fulfilling of righteous. It is important that baptism be performed in the name of Jesus, because Jesus is the saving name of God. The other

dimension of the new birth experience is infilling of the Holy Spirit. God desires to live on the inside of us. Thus, when one has committed their belief towards God and repented of their sins, they can ask God to come dwell on the inside of them, and He will. To verify that the infilling has taken place, God will speak through the believer in a spiritual language. In the bible, this language is called tongues. Speaking in tongues is the initial sign that one has been filled, but a holy life and conscious towards God is the evidence that this process has taken place. What a wonderful God we have! He is gracious enough to come and dwell on the inside of us. The following scriptures provide support to the power of baptism and infilling of the Holy Spirit.

Joel 2:28

And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions:

Matthew 3:11

I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance. but he that cometh after me is mightier than I, whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire:

²²Repent therefore of this thy wickedness, and pray God, if perhaps the thought of thine heart may be forgiven thee.

²³For I perceive that thou art in the gall of bitterness, and in the bond of iniquity.

²⁴Then answered Simon, and said, Pray ye to the LORD for me, that none of these things which ye have spoken come upon me.

Prayer/Fasting

God loves us so much that he wants to communicate with us consistently. This communication is called prayer. Prayer is a conversation between you and God. It is a time in which we speak to God and he speaks to us in our spirits. Prayer is one of the central roles of the Church and must be a major tenant in the life of the believer. It is the act of petitioning or making a request. Without prayer, we cannot have true fellowship with God. Prayer is personal and corporate. You should set aside private time to pray to God. This time should be personal and consistent. Personal prayer does not always have to be in private. You can pray within your spirit throughout the day concerning issues that are on your heart or situations that arise throughout the day. Corporate prayer is another way we commune with God. We gather as a Church to pray to God about our world, nation, state, city, church, and families. During corporate prayer, we bring all of our issues to God; believing that He will answer and provide all that we need. Prayer is the key to every believer's success in Christianity and must be the focal point of our lives. There is an old saying that states, "Much prayer...much power. Some prayer...some power. No Prayer...NO POWER!" We must be a people of prayer because the Lord states, "My house shall be called the house of prayer..."(Matthew 12:13).

Fasting is the companion of prayer. Concerning demonic forces, Jesus states that they can only be broken by fasting and prayer (Mark 9:29). This emphasizes the power and importance of combining fasting with prayer. Fasting means to go without. Fasting removes the most basic need of human existence, which causes an increased reliance on God to provide and sustain. We fast for a spiritual purpose. Going without food without a spiritual purpose is simply dieting. When we fast, we maintain a spiritual mind-set and focus on the spiritual maturity and blessings we desire God to provide for us. Fasting gives the believer victory over the world. Fasting can also be conducted personally and corporately. As an Overcomer, you must take the initiative to set fast times for yourself. You, your family, and friends should make it a priority to take special times to fast for spiritual growth and maturity. There will be times when the spiritual leader of our church will call everyone to fast for a specific time. It is vital that you discipline yourself and fast for the duration of

the time set. When God's people fast and pray together, supernatural miracles and blessings will be released by God.

2 Chronicles 7

¹Now when Solomon had made an end of praying, the fire came down from heaven, and consumed the burnt offering and the sacrifices; and the glory of the LORD filled the house.

²And the priests could not enter into the house of the LORD, because the glory of the LORD had filled the LORD's house.

³And when all the children of Israel saw how the fire came down, and the glory of the LORD upon the house, they bowed themselves with their faces to the ground upon the pavement, and worshipped, and praised the LORD, saying, For he is good; for his mercy endureth for ever.

⁹And in the eighth day they made a solemn assembly: for they kept the dedication of the altar seven days, and the feast seven days.

¹⁰And on the three and twentieth day of the seventh month he sent the people away into their tents, glad and merry in heart for the goodness that the LORD had shewed unto David, and to Solomon, and to Israel his people.

Studying the Word

The Word of God is the greatest resource in the Kingdom. It is literally the will, motive, and mind of God. The vast majority of your Christian walk will be consumed with God speaking to you through His word. The bible is the infallible word of God. It is God's design for your life. In the Word of God is all of His promises, covenants, and commandments, which provide us with the power to have a good life and eternal salvation. All of your questions about life can be answered in the Word of God. This is why it is so important that you dedicate yourself to reading the Word of God. Study time must be your most valued asset. Set a regular time that you can study every day. Don't allow other things to interfere with your Bible study time. Mornings are best, even though you may have to get up earlier, because your mind is basically as uncluttered as it is going to be. As the day progresses we have more and more on our minds to think about.

God is inextricably tied to His word. Therefore, all of your success as a believer is connected to your ability to understand, accept, and obey God's word. God is not obligated to bless anything outside of His will. It is only when we walk in His will that the covenant blessings promised to us are manifested. Some people like to read the Psalms and Proverbs, other like to read the Gospels. Your spiritual teachers will guide you through the process of accessing the Word of God. It is also a great idea to get a version that you can understand. You may also want to read the bible from beginning to end, which will provide a solid foundation of understanding, wisdom and guidance for the rest of your life. If you commit yourself to studying the word of God, there will be nothing outside of your spiritual reach.

Worship

As Overcomers, we must live lives of personal and public holiness. Personal worship is how we worship God with our words, acts and deeds. We worship God when we speak highly of Him; exalting Him for His mighty acts. We worship God when we behave in a manner becoming of holiness; continuing to purify our hearts with good thoughts and His word. We also worship God with how we treat and interact with people. Worship is a life-style, not a 30-minute event during Sunday services. As you allow your life to be molded into one of true worship, God will open up doors for you to be blessed and prosperous.

Evangelism

We witness through word and deed. We invite people to fellowship at our church, because we know that God always meets us during our service times. We also encourage others to come to Christ by sharing the wonderful things that He has done for us specifically and for all people through His death, burial, and resurrection. We also evangelize by our life styles and good deeds. Living a life that is peaceable with all men, showing kindness, and exhibiting the character of Christ also lead men and women to want to know our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. At Bethesda, evangelism is intertwined into every auxiliary and every program. Evangelism is the backbone to the whole church vision and purpose. We can not bring healing to the nations if we do not evangelize.

\mathbf{T} ithes and Offering

The Kingdom economy is supported, sustained and propelled by tithes and offerings. The principle of tithing is well documented throughout scripture. It is the practice of giving 10% of our income. Our tithe belongs to God. He requires it and blesses us when we submit to this act of obedience. Our offering is a free-will offering. We give our offering out of the cheerfulness and desire of our heart. Your tithe is your obligation to God. Your offering is your seed. We give as God has blessed us; knowing that our offering is a seed that will bring forth fruit. Remember, a seed is always smaller than the fruit it bears. Therefore, we know that God honors our giving. It is also important to note that our church operates through the freewill tithes and offerings that members and non-members give. We give to Bethesda to free our leader and ministerial staff up to be able to handle the business necessary for the church to run effectively and efficiently. It takes the contributions of every member to ensure that our church continues to be a leader in providing the wide range of services that people need. The ability of Bethesda to continue to lead men and women to come to Christ, develop in Him, and have various other spiritual, emotional and social needs met, requires that we give liberally and freely, because it is the will of God.

Holiness

As Overcomers, we strive to live a holy and sanctified life. To be sanctified, means to be set apart for God's purpose. Through the prayer, fasting, studying to word, and worship, we develop a relationship with God that gives us the power to live a life that is pleasing to Him. Overcomers work daily to purify their hearts, thoughts, and deeds. The Overcomer expresses personal holiness and public holiness. Personal holiness focuses on keeping the laws of God and living a life pure in spirit and deed. Public holiness is how we carry ourselves in public. The music we listen to, the way we speak, and activity involvement should all give glory to God. We depend on God's word to show us what is right and wrong, and work through the Holy Spirit to obey His word.

Empathy and Love

Love is the most powerful expression of God. There is no other expression that signifies God's motive and will for all of His creation more than love. God is love (1 John 4:8) and moves throughout the universe based on that nature. God requires us to show people the same love that he has shown us. We have experienced the love of God through our priceless salvation. What a wonderful God who would bring us out of darkness into this marvelous light (1 Peter 2:9). Love is the foundation of Christianity. There is no Christianity without love. Anyone declaring them self to be a child of God, yet has no love, they are sadly mistaken about their position with God. We must love people despite of their position in life. Love is also the key marker by which other people will know that we are Christians (John 13:34-35). When we love people, they will want to know our God. For many believers, they find it hard to love in a manner that God requires, because of their experiences in life. Our actions, motives, and words should be motivated by love. Love should also be a central focus of our prayer life. We should continually ask God to help us love beyond our experiences, biases, and prejudices.

Spiritual Fruit and Gifting

As a New Overcomer, the Lord desires you to move into the spiritual depth and width of those provisions given to all believers. Spirituality is the key to living a life of overcoming. You must have your mind renewed so that the "new man" can operate victoriously in this life. The Fruit of the Spirit and Spiritual Gifts go hand and hand. The Fruit of the Spirit focus on the character and maturity of the believer and the Gifts of the Spirit focus on the power and tools of the believer. There has been much misinformation in the Body of Christ concerning the purpose and use of Spiritual Gifts. This misinformation has placed an inappropriate focus on gifts while neglecting the relevance and importance of Spiritual Fruit. Jesus states, "Ye shall know them by their fruit." The Fruit of the Spirit displays an intimate relationship with Christ. If a Believer never displays the Fruit of the Spirit, their "Spiritual Gifting" is in vain or is NOT of God. At Bethesda, we don't subscribe to the idea that a Believer can live their whole saved life as a "Carnal Christian". Although we understand what some may mean by this idea, we believe that a true Believer will demonstrate the Fruit of the Spirit. When someone claiming to be a Christian is only able to demonstrate carnality, they are more than likely not a Christian. Therefore, the Overcomer should seek the Lord to ensure that their Spiritual Gifting is undergirded by the Fruit of the Spirit.

Galatians 5:14-26

¹⁴For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

¹⁵But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another.

Determination

At Bethesda, we believe that determination is vital in order to live a powerful life in Christ. We use the term determination as the by-product of healthy faith. When a believer has a strong constitution of word-based faith, they will live be determined to fulfill the convictions of that faith. The Overcomer is able to defeat all personal, social, spiritual and emotional conflict through their determined disposition. Often times, Believers get discouraged in the faith because of social relationships and circumstances that they may face. However, if the Overcomer has a strong disposition of determination, they will be able to trust in the word of God and stand firm in trying times. Determination should not be discounted as insignificant. None of the other 6 previous tenants will mean anything if the Overcomer gives up before they experience the wonderful life God has planned for them. Many people begin strong, but when hard situations arise, they give up. As an Overcomer, you must be willing endure hardship and actively participate in your salvation experience.

Hebrews 12:1-13

${f A}$ ttitude

Every New Overcomer's Core Experiences must be solidified with a great positive attitude towards God, leadership, self, family, other believers and community. Please note that these six entities (God, leadership, self, family, other believers and community) are representative of the number of man. In order to become a complete man or woman in God, you must develop the right attitude towards these entities. When you were in the world, you may have acquired some attitudes that are against the very nature of God. These attitudes include, insecurity, pessimism, suspicions, gossip, seductions, mean spiritedness, vindications, revenge, stubbornness, combativeness, rivalries, unruliness, outspokenness, bitterness, and many other attitude driven vices that block the power of God in both one's vertical and horizontal relationships. Attitude is an area of great difficulty for some, but it must be mastered in order to truly walk with God. Attitude is an area that all Overcomers must constantly assess and improve.

There are eight attitudes that all Overcomers should have. The 8 attitudes all Overcomes should develop, maintain, and perfect are: <u>Humility, Pliability, Compassion, Submission, Negotiable, Proactive, Empathy, and Optimism</u>. These 8 attitudes will ensure that Bethesda remains a place of safety and healing to the nations. It will also ensure that all social interaction between believers have governing agents that enhance fellowship. At Bethesda, we want the world to see the love of Christ in us and through us. In order for this to happen, we must have a positive, pliable, and appropriate attitude.

¹¹Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;

¹²Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;

¹³Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.

¹⁴Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not.

¹⁵Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep.

¹⁶Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.

¹⁷Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men.

¹⁸If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.

¹⁹Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.

²⁰Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head.

²¹Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.
